
## French Grammar Express: Relative pronouns Que & Qui

Reminder: a pronoun replaces a word, often to prevent repetition.

A relative pronoun will act as a linking word.



## It works the same in French!

Use qui [kee] (who, that) to replace the subject.

je connais <u>la fille</u>. <u>La fille</u> chante. *I know the girl. The girl is singing.* 

je connais <u>la fille</u> qui chante. I know the girl who is singing.

j'aime <u>le pain</u>. <u>Le pain</u> est frais. *I like bread. The bread is fresh.* 

j'aime <u>le pain</u> qui est frais.

I like bread that bread is fresh.

Use que [kuh] (whom, that, which) to replace the object.

J'aime la voiture que tu conduis la voiture. I like the car that you drive.

Tu vois <u>la fille</u> que je connais <u>la fille</u>. You see the girl whom (that) I know.

You cannot leave out the relative pronoun in French.
