When do we use the conditional tense?

A. To refer to hypothetical events depending on a certain condition.

If I had money,

I **would** travel.

The condition

What would happen if the condition was met.

= the conditional

B. To be polite.

I want a coffee.

I **would** like a coffee.

C. To express a wish

I **would** like to learn French.

D. To give advice.

You **should** do more exercise.

E. To express the future in the past

He told us that he **would** arrive on Monday.

Forming the conditional

Stem of the simple future (infinitive)

- danser
- finir
- vendre

Irregular stems

Infinitive	Stem
avoir (to have)	aur- [ohr]
être (to be)	ser- [suhr]
faire (to do)	fer- [fuhr]
aller (to go)	ir- [eer]
devoir (to have to)	devr- [duhvr]
pouvoir (to be able to)	pourr- [poor]
vouloir (to want to)	voudr- [voodr]
voir (to see)	verr- [vehr]
savoir (to know)	saur- [sohr]
envoyer (to send)	enverr- [ãvehr]
venir (to come)	viendr- [viēdr]

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Endings of the imperfect tense

Je	-ais [eh]
Tu	-ais [eh]
Il/elle/on	-ait [eh]
Nous	-ions [eeõ]
Vous	-iez [ee😊]
Ils/elles	-aient [eh]

Pronunciation tip



For the future tense and the conditional, remember the sound [r]

Future: Je mangerai, tu auras, il fera...

Conditional: Je chanterais, tu aurais, il ferait...
