

# French Grammar Express: Demonstrative Adjectives

Demonstrative adjectives are special adjectives that describe the position of something or someone in space or time.

In English they are:

**this**    **these**  
└──────────┘  
close, here

**that**    **those**  
└──────────┘  
further, there

In French, remember that adjectives **agree** with the noun they describe (masculine, feminine, singular, plural).

## French demonstrative adjectives

\*Reminder → a = un, une, des (some) → the = le, la, les, l'

		Masculine	Feminine
Singular	<i>this, that</i>	Ce [suh] Cet [seht] (before vowel or h)	Cette [seht]
Plural	<i>these, those</i>	Ces [seh]	



### This and that? These and those?

If you want to be more specific, you can add:

**-ci** [see] (*here*) or **-là** [lah] (*there*)

Ce pull-**ci** → **this** jumper (*here*)

Cette jupe-**là** → **that** skirt (*there*)

Ces pulls-**ci** → **these** jumpers (*here*)

Ces robes-**là** → **those** dresses (*there*)
